tongue-and-groove panelling with open shelving, which is currently on-trend. Because a boot room is also where muddy boots and shoes will be stored, together with pet accessories, the flooring is of equal importance to the furniture – stone floors are one option, but we recommend contemporary floor tiles in different colours and finishes, which look stunning in a small space and are easy to clean.”

Additional elements to consider are closed-door storage for a clutter-free finish, as well as durable materials such as solid-oak seating, water and scratch-resistant paint, and birch-ply or oak-veneer internal fittings. Look to include underfloor heating, air bricks, drying racks and a heated towel rail to combat moisture and humidity.

“Choosing a company that specialises in made-to-measure cabinetry is a must,” advises McCarron & Co creative services director Andy Barette, “as the furniture should be specifically tailor-made to fit the space. Slatted shelving works well, allowing items to air, and proper boot racks can be discreetly rubber-lined for easy cleaning.”
